
Year 4



This week in year 4 we have been learning about the digestive system. The children enjoyed watching it in action. They won't forget it soon!



Year 5



From learning about squared numbers (numbers multiplied by themselves eg 8x 8), Year 5s moved on to cubed numbers and how to calculate the answers. Here's some examples showing 3³ (3x3x3) and 6³ (6x6x6). Do you know why we didn't make the 12³ shape (12x12x12)?

Year 6

Year 6 have been getting fully immersed into this half terms book, Hidden Figures. This book tells the story of three African-American women who played a vital role during the early years of the U.S. space program and has prompted some wonderful discussion in year 6 about inequality these women faced at the time.
