The children enjoyed going to church to sing some seasonal songs as well as some hymns. The food has been split between our own school foodbank and The Welcome Centre. Please if you need food at all, let us know. We are all there for each other.

Next Friday we will be having a 'Belong' day where the children can come in an alternative to school uniforms should they wish. They can come in clothing they show other groups they may belong to e.g. scouts, a football team, a dance club or even some traditional wear. Yet again, I am reaching out to you all on the issues about driving and parking near and around the school grounds.
