UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

Our uniform expectations continue to be the same as previous years and we ask all parents to support this.

All children wear navy blue, v-neck sweatshirts or cardigans. Logo versions are available from our uniform suppliers, Term Time Wear and Natasha, but plain alternatives can also be worn. We recognise that logo clothes can initially be more expensive but they are of good quality, wash well and can be handed on after they are outgrown.

Children from Reception to Year 4 wear light blue polo shirts – these can be with or without the school logo.

Years 5&6 wear white shirts (short or long sleeve) with a school tie.







All children should wear grey uniform trousers, skirts or pinafore dresses. In warmer weather, children can wear blue and white gingham dresses or shorts of an appropriate length to provide full coverage when sitting, bending and taking part in active play.











SHOES: Children should wear sturdy BLACK school shoes, ankle boots or smart BLACK trainers. Crocs and other fashion footwear are not appropriate for school. Slip-ons, open toes and heels are not suitable for outdoor and active learning.

OUTDOORS: Children need a warm, waterproof coat as we work/play outdoors whenever possible. It is helpful if children in Reception bring a pair of wellies (any colour/design) to keep in school – but we have spares they can use if this is not possible.

PE KIT: Children should come to school in PE kit instead of school uniform on their PE days; house colour t-shirt, plain black shorts/leggings/tracksuit bottoms, plain black pumps or trainers and their school jumper or cardigan.













HAIR: We recognise that hair styles can reflect culture and identify and we do not have rules which limit each child's uniqueness. We do ask that head scarves, wraps, bobbles and bows reflect the spirit of school uniform and match our colours. Children may be asked to tie long hair back for certain practical lessons.

JEWELLERY: Jewellery is not suitable for young children at school, we will make limited exceptions if necessary for example: small gold stud earrings, Sikh Kara bracelets. Health and safety will be our first priority. **Please note children in Year 5 go swimming and earrings must be removed for these lessons.**

Make up, temporary tattoos and nail polish/acrylics/gel are not part of our uniform and we ask that they are removed for school.

Back packs are NOT SUITABLE for school due to limited storage space. Children DO NOT need to provide their own stationery.

PLEASE NAME EVERYTHING YOUR CHILD WEARS OR BRINGS TO SCHOOL - PARTICULARLY COATS & JUMPERS.

Sharpie, name stickers or sewn in name tags all work – please check after every wash if using pen.
