In Collectve Worship this week we have been continuing to explore our value of 'Belong'. In our whole school 'Welcome to the Week' we looked at how if we get loose our way in school, and things aren't right, just like the shepherd in the parable of the lost sheep, instead of being angry and cross about what has happened, we can forgive and learn. Reception

Year 1

In Year 1 we have been looking at materials in science. Here we are matching objects that are made from natural and human made materials.



Year 2

This week in RE the year 2 children had a walk around the school grounds and looked at places in school they may not have visited before. The children enjoyed playing in the key stage 2 playground.



Year 3



This week year 3 took on a watercolour challenge in art. Children were given a painting by an artist to study the use of primary and secondary colours. They then had to try and re-create the same colours onto a background and add painted shapes.

Year 4

This week in year 4 we have been learning about discrimination and inclusion in PSHE. We have been discussing how discrimination might make a person feel and the value that inclusion brings to us all in society.



Year 5



In 5JF the children have staterd their swimming lesson. Mrs Jones says- what a brilliant swimming lesson they had this week. The water confidence of all has vastly improved in just 3

weeks. Now that the excitement of the swimming lesson has past, pupils are listening well and

skills are already improving. We started week 1 with only 5 children in the deep end and now there are 10:)

Across Year 5s are studying Earth and Space, so went on to the school field to understand how the planets orbit the sun, and their

distances. The front pupil represents the Sun - the others are planets in our Solar System - can you name them?

Year 6

Year six have been enjoying reading our new novel Gorilla Dawn by Gill Lewis.
