They drew in the semi 2-2 v Dalton but went out on penalties which was cruel The girls were a real credit to the themselves & the school even when they lost the pen shoot out.


Big Shout to Bella G (Y5) who scored 20 goals in 11 games in the whole comp.

Thursday 7th March 2024




Children are more likely to enjoy reading when their choices are championed and we make reading fun.


The day will start after registration with a World Book Day assembly at 8:55.


The majority of the day is very much up to you. But the book that you choose needs to be one with a sporting theme running through.
