Year 1

In Geography this week Year 1 have been looking at position and direction. We used directional language to guide our friends. Back in class we directed the beebot on a treasure map.





Year 2

This week year 2 have been looking at significant people in history. The children learnt the words activist, explorer, monarch, artist and scientist and matched these words to the people they have learnt about. In pairs, the children ordered the significant people in chronological order.
